Passport and Visa Requirements

Foreign nationals requiring a visa should apply directly to the Embassy, Consulate or Diplomatic Mission of Thailand in their own country.

Delegates will receive "Official Invitation Letter" issued by CCOP via fax and/or e-mail for obtaining entry visa to Thailand and/or for the travel approval from their organizations.

Note: Passport must be valid for at least six months upon arrival.



Reception upon Arrival

The Delegates will be met by the Thai staff at Chiang Mai International Airport and transferred to The Kantary Hills Hotel, their booked hotels. Delegates should inform the Organizing Secretariat on their expected dates, time and flight details in advance.



Currency

The currency in Thailand is Thai Baht (THB). Exchange rate is US\$ 1 approximately Baht 32. Exchange of currency may be done at the airport, local banks, money exchangers and hotels around the city. Major credit cards are widely accepted.

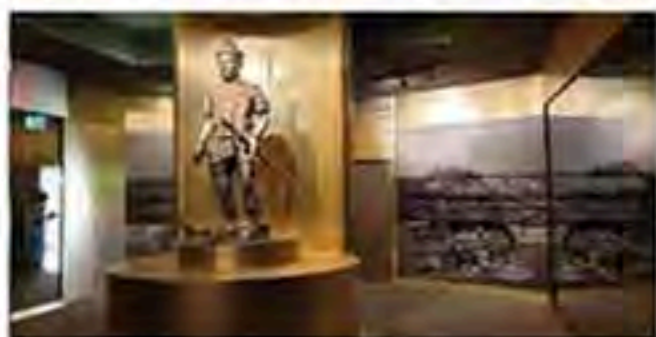

Introduction of Chiang Mai Province



CHIANG MAI is known as Thailand's "Rose of the North", a cultural and natural wonderland with ethnic diversity, a multitude of attractions and welcoming hospitality. It is founded as the capital of the Lanna Kingdom on Thursday, 12 April 1296 by King Meng Rai the Great. It is located approximately 700 km north of Bangkok. Chiang Mai is the largest city in Northern Thailand and it is one of the premier tourist destinations in Thailand. Chiang Mai has been attracting over 10 million visitors each year. It is considered an area of nature, cold weather, and diverse culture. Chiang Mai is one of the few places in Thailand where visitors can experience both historical and modern Thai culture coexisting side by side.

The old city of Chiang Mai is a showcase of the north's fascinating indigenous cultural identity that includes diverse dialects, a delectable cuisine, distinctive architecture, traditional values, lively festivals, numerous handicrafts workshops, northern style massage, and classical dances. Chiang Mai is also blessed with pristine natural resources including mountains, waterfalls, and rivers. The presence of numerous hill tribes that feature a wealth of unique cultures enhances Chiang Mai's distinctive diversity. Hill tribe trekking, often combined with river rafting and elephant riding has always been one of Chiang Mai's greatest tourist attractions. A number of top destinations in Chiang Mai include Doi Inthanon National Park, Doi Suthep, Doi Ang Khang, Mae Sa Elephant Camp, Ratchaphruek Garden, San kamphaeng hot springs, Baan Tawai, Wualai (Saturday market) Walking Street and Sunday market walking street, etc. Chiang Mai also offers outstanding geological sites where geodiversity can be easily explored.

Nowadays there are innumerable activities and attractions both in the city and the surrounding province, both backpackers and luxury tourists can enjoy the ultimate Thailand holiday.
