The course will start on Monday the 20th of February 2017 with a short inauguration ceremony at the **Presidential Suite, Room 2734, Crown Building, Holiday Inn**. Classes will be delivered in the same room during 20-24 February 2017, while classes during **28 February to 2 March** will be held at **The Curve Room, Chatrium Hotel**.

It is planned to realize a one day field excursion on Monday, the 27th of February 2017 to visit interesting spots in the surroundings of Bangkok.

Participation:

Full participation in the workshop is necessary to grasp the complex subject matter and working procedures for the application in future work. Participants are therefore required to attend the entire course curriculum and stay up to the end of the workshop.

Arrival and Departure, Transfers:

All participants are expected on Monday, 20th of February 2017, 08:30 (s.t.) at the workshop venue, Presidential Suite. The workshop will end on Thursday, 2nd of March 2017.

Participants coming from outside Thailand are expected to arrive Bangkok on Sunday, 19th of February 2017 and depart Bangkok on Friday, 3rd of March 2017. In arriving Bangkok, participants are requested to take a metered taxi from Suvarnabhumi Airport to Holiday Inn Bangkok Silom, and on departure from Chatrium Hotel Riverside Bangkok to Suvarnabhumi Airport. It will not cost you more than 500 Thai Bahts each way by metered taxi. An equivalent

of 1000 Thai Bahts will be added to the daily subsistence allowance to cover the costs of airport transfer.

All participants coming from abroad will checkout from Holiday Inn Silom on Saturday, 25th of February 2017, and transfer to Chatrium Hotel Riverside. Transportation will be arranged by the CCOP Technical Secretariat.

Catering:

Lunch and snacks during the training days will be provided free of charge to all participants at the course venue.

Requirements:

- Basic understanding in hazard, vulnerability and risk concepts. Working experience is desirable;
- Basic knowledge in GIS and MS Access Database;
- English language skills;
- **Personal Laptop with ArcGIS 10.0 and MS Access 2007 or 2010 software installed.**
